Kaprow Reinvented: Pose, 1969-2019May 22 – July 10, 2019

Tampa, Florida - May 13, 2019 - USF Contemporary Art Museum, part of the Institute for Research in Art in the College of The Arts, presents *Kaprow Reinvented: Pose, 1969-2019,* a pop-up performance and participatory reinvention of Allan Kaprow's *Pose,* reinvented by Tampa-based artist Vince Kral; co-organized by Alyssa Cordero. Every Wednesday, on the USF Tampa campus, Kral invites the public to visit us and reinvent Kaprow's *Pose*.

The above is the script for the original *Pose* performance, one of Allan Kaprow's *Six Ordinary Happenings*. Kaprow's *Happenings* were performative, semi-spontaneous works that were designed to be repeated, or revisited, by others, becoming *reinventions* that changed with every iteration. Kaprow did not distinguish between art and life—art is life and life is art. The *Happenings* are purposeful but subtle interruptions of both everyday moments and the established understanding of art viewing. Now, 50 years after Kaprow's first incarnation of *Pose*, USFCAM has organized a timely reinvention by Tampa-based artist, Vince Kral, graciously permitted by the Allan Kaprow Estate.

Through the weekly *Pop-up Mediation Post (PMP)*—which will be held every Wednesday—Kral will facilitate an open dialogue between passersby, Kaprow's *Pose*, and himself. These *PMP*'s will provide information about Kaprow's work and all material for participants to reinvent *Pose* themselves. For the duration of the project, there will be an online digital map of all locations where *Pose* was reinvented, and people from all over are encouraged to participate in the exhibition with instructions found at cam.usf.edu/kaprow. BIOS

<u>Vincent J. Kral</u> is a Tampa-based artist who exhibits throughout the United States. Kral uses video, performance, and digital media to engage with people. He works as Curator of the Corporate Partnership Program and Chief Preparator for USFCAM. Kral earned his BFA in Studio Art with an emphasis in Electronic Media from USF in 2007 and is a 2020 Candidate for an MFA in Studio Art from the Vermont College of Fine Arts.

Allan Kaprow (1927-2006) was an American artist, recognized as the father of *Happenings*. Kaprow was also a cultural critic and lifelong educator who steered numerous generations of students into a style of art making that was simultaneously cerebral, utopian, political, improvisational, and infused with wit. After an early career as a painter under the tutelage of Hans Hoffmann, Kaprow moved during the late 1950s and 1960s toward impermanent interactive environments and participatory events, which often featured ordinary activities taking place in everyday spaces. Kaprow wrote that the line between art and life should be kept as fluid, and perhaps indistinct, as possible. Kaprow's work has been exhibited and performed extensively throughout the United States and internationally. Kaprow's work is managed by the Allan Kaprow Estate and represented by Hauser & Wirth. allankaprow.com
